Clocktower raising draws a crowd

COOKEVILLE — The staff and friends of Putnam 1st Mercantile Bank were on hand to witness the raising of a replica of the 1900s Putnam Courthouse cock tower at the construction site of the Putnami 1st Mercantile Bank on Jackson Street

"It is important to us for this bank to represent the best of Putnam County's past as well as the future. One way is to place a clocktower that is representative of the old courthouse clocktower on our
